• 'H' in Spanish is silent: 'hola' (hi) is pronounced "ola" • 'LL' is pronounced as 'Y': Pollo (chicken) is pronounced 'poyo'
5 vowels: A = fAther (ah) | E = stEp (eh) | I = fEEt (ee) | O = British 'stOp' (oh) | U = bOOt
