
Day Two: Sunday, December 23, 2018 WELCOME TO ISRAEL

## Day Three: Monday, December 24, 2018 **HEAVENLY AND EARTHLY ISRAEL**

### Option #2:

■ 1:00 p.m. The Strangers Among Us: Explore the fascinating neighborhood of Neve Sha'anan in South Tel Aviv as a microcosm of Israel. In recent years, Israel has seen a significant rise in non-Jewish immigrants such as migrant workers, asylum-seekers and refugees, presenting new challenges to the Jewish State. With our own eyes we will see how diverse groups have left their impact on Israel and on the neighborhood. This tour will be led by a scholar from Bina, the secular Yeshiva in Tel Aviv.

- 3:00 p.m. Depart Tel Aviv, drive to the Elma Arts Complex Luxury Hotel in Zichron Ya'acov and check in. The hotel's iconic main building was constructed in 1968 as the Mivtachim Sanatorium and gained worldwide recognition for its innovative design, earning architect Yaacov Rechter the prestigious Israel Award for Architecture in 1973. Purchased by Lily Elstein in 2005, the building was the centerpiece of her vision to create a world-class center for the arts and boutique hotel. Under the guidance of Amnon Rechter, Yaakov Rechter's son, the building was restored according to the original plans and original materials to add two state-of-the-art concert halls and art galleries.

### Option #1:

■ Free time to explore the hotel's world-class spa and facilities. The Elma Spa's unique philosophy stimulates both mind and body. Tibetan bowls and cymbals, tank drums, harps... these and many more instruments intensify the experience through the deep connection between mind, body, and music.

### Day Three: Monday, December 24, 2018 **HEAVENLY AND EARTHLY ISRAEL**

### Option #2:

■ 6:00 p.m. Living as a Minority in the Jewish State: Explore with Professor Dalia Fadila, President of the Technology and Science College of Baqa al Garbia, the reality of Arabs living in Israel and what it means to be the first Arab woman president of an institution of higher education in Israel. Meet with Avivit Hai, Program Director in Israel for the Inter Agency Task Force on Israeli Arab Issues who is the "eyes and ears" of the Task Force, liaising with local players - from government officials to Arab, Jewish and joint NGOs - leading a number of information-sharing and coalition-building efforts.

- Enjoy an **evening concert** by **Ilham אלהאם וושוא,** a young band of Arab and Jewish musicians who play classical Arabic and classical music together with Israeli and Western music.

# Day Four: Tuesday, December 25, 2018 THE MOSAIC OF ISRAEL @ 70

  - Option #1: The Art Within: Guided tour of the hotel's widely acclaimed private art collection.
  - Option #2: Guided visit to Zichron Ya'acov, one of the first communities established by the early Zionist pioneers, including a stop next to the Aaronsohn House to delve into the world of a Jewish spy ring active during the First World War.
  - Option #3: Nature walk through the dazzling Ramat Hanadiv Gardens, dedicated to Baron de Rothschild (the "Nadiv" or "Benefactor"), located on the outskirts of Zichron Ya'acov.

#### All:

- 11:30 a.m. **Building a Pluralistic Community in Israel**: Dialogue with **Rabbi Elisha Wolfin** from **Kehillat Veahavta**, the Masorti congregation in Zichron Ya'acov.
- Lunch and shopping on own in the colorful **Pedestrian Mall** in Zichron Ya'acov.
- 2:30 p.m. An Old-New Perspective of Minorities in Shefaram:
  Explore the city of Shefaram, located between the bottom of the Carmel Ridge and the entrance to the Galilee. Once a Jewish center during the Talmudic period, this ancient-modern Arab town later became one of the Crusades' posts and was eventually taken over by the Muslim Ottoman Empire. This heuristic tour with a local Arab guide will include visits to a:
  - Mosque and dialogue with the Muezzin (the Muslim clergy) about Islam and the life of a Muslim Arab in Israel.
  - Roman Catholic Church with its beautiful art, to learn about the unique story of the Eastern Christians living in Israel.
  - Old Synagogue of Shefaram abandoned in the 1900's to engage in a conversation about the minorities in the land throughout the ages.

- Special visit to **Beit Issie Shapiro**. The mission of Beit Issie Shapiro is to provide cutting-edge services to improve quality of life for people with disabilities, and to effect social change by breaking down the barriers preventing people with disabilities. Beit Issie Shapiro is a world-wide recognized leader in research and therapies for the disabled and as such enjoys status as a Special Consultant to the United Nations and has been named Israel's Most Effective Non-Profit.

- Drive to Jerusalem.

- **Hebron:** A **Tale of Two Cities**: Head deeper into the Judean Hills, arriving in Area H2, the Israeli controlled part of **Hebron**, the largest city in the West Bank.
- 10:00 a.m. & 1:00 p.m. A Jewish Perspective: Take an inside look at one of the most pivotal components of the discussion of Jewish settlement, including the Tomb of the Patriarchs (Machpelah), Tel Rumeida and Beit Hadassah, guided by Director of Tourism, Rabbi Simcha Hochbaum. Meet with local residents for an overview of Jewish life in Hebron and the relationship of Israelis with their Palestinian neighbors; dialogue regarding the future of the city.







- 10:00 a.m. **Beyond the Black Hat**: The ultra-Orthodox world is vital and growing but remains unknown, even alien, to many of us. Get a better understanding of this world through tours of the Haredi neighborhoods of **Geula** and **Mea Shearim**. Local guides from these communities will discuss their lifestyles, belief systems, dress codes and much more.
- Walk through the hustle and bustle of Jerusalem's **Machaneh Yehudah** open-air market: Enjoy the sights, smells, tastes and sounds of this vibrant area where Jerusalemites shop.
- Lunch on own.
- 2:00 p.m. Visit Ammunition Hill, site of a Jordanian Police Academy until 1967 and one of the most crucial battle sites for the unification of Jerusalem during the Six-Day War. Tour the newly opened and moving museum, including a dialogue with Alon Wald, son of Rami Wald, an IDF captain and a war hero who fell on the first day of fighting. At the outbreak of the war, Alon was only 10-months-old and since then he has spent much of his adult life trying to piece together the story of his father's bravery. The journey is what led him to give a voice to those who fell in the battle for Jerusalem and share their untold stories with visitors.
